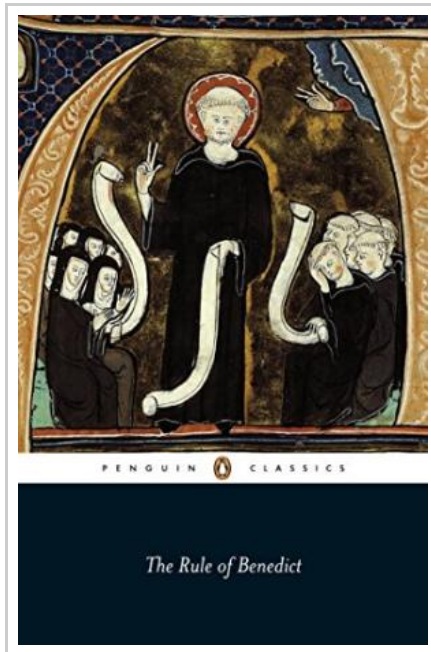




The Rule of Benedict
